Olympics Postponed



The COVID19 has left the sporting world almost paralysed. Some events are being rescheduled for later date while some are being called off. Finally the IOC, Japanese govt. and members of the Tokyo Olympic Committee have decided to push back the Olympics by a year. Simultaneously the Para Olympics also get delayed.

'The greatest Show on Earth', The Olympics have a history of being disrupted almost every 40 years, for some reason or another. However this is the first time that the Olympics are being rescheduled. The event were to start on the 24th of July this year. On 24th March the IOC president Mr Thomas Bach spoke over teleconference with the Japanese president Mr Shinzo Abe. The 'Japanese-PM' said "I proposed that the Olympics be pushed back by a year, The IOC president was in complete agreement with this proposal". Therefore the Tokyo Olympics will now be held on 2021 along with the Para Olympics.

The World Athletics Organisation has said that doubts remain as to the number of stadiums that would be available for the conduct of Olympics at a later date. Further this decision has not gone down well with many people associated with the Olympics. The IOC and Tokyo Olympics Games committee are now preparing to face these new challenges.

Battling Lockdown

The city of Joy entered its seventh day of lockdown today on 28th march. Imposed by the state first on 22nd, after a day's Janata curfew and extended by the centre on 24th, the lockdown is set to continue till 14th April.

The city is slowly coming to grips with this new experience as novel as the virus itself. 22nd was a bandh like experience with cricket on the street, a leisurely adda at the para more as we have seen it earlier, was the mood. The jolt came in the evening when certain parts of the state were locked down. The first

reaction was panic buying, profiteering, hoarding and black marketeering. Despite repeated assurances by the govt both state and centre, that all essential and emergency services would be exempt, the announcement of the lockdown triggered a mad rush to the markets. It was a situation the govt wanted the citizens to avoid.

Day two saw some heavy handed police action who were learning on the job too. Public disapproval to these actions flooded the social media. Swift corrective and necessary additional action

on lockdown relief improved the situation on day three. The doctors, emergency services staff, Police and the administration combined forces to combat the situation by day 4. The ground reality on day 5 is: medicines are available, so are dry and green groceries, milk, bread, fish and meat. Petrol pumps are open, ATMs functional. Day 6 and day 7 saw further improvement in home deliveries. Citizen are responding well regardless of monetary or social standing. The challenges are daunting but the situation is not hopeless.

India unites on Janata Curfew

The entire world is under severe crisis due to COVID-19. In such critical situation India will observe a 'Janata curfew' from Sunday 22nd March as appealed and announced by PM Modi. People have been advised to willingly stay indoors to check the spread of corona virus while public transport was suspended and reduced and all markets and shops apart from those dealing in essential items was closed on the day.

All states were directed to deliver the execution with proper implementation of the curfew. As it was the need of the hour. Union Home Minister Amit Shah asked everyone in the country to support the step. Everyone experienced
