## CA student falls to death from Panta Bhat finds favour with foodies high-rise building in Kasba

A female Chartered Accountancy (CA) student named Tamanna Hiraowat (19), fell to her death from the roof of a multi-storey building in

She used to stay on one of the upper floors of a building in the Picnic Garden area within Kasba Police Station limits. She fell from the 25th floor of that building this morning. The police are investigating whether the incident was an accident or a suicide. According to police sources, the incident occurred at Meghmani Apartment on Naskarhat Road in the Picnic Garden area between 3:00 and 4:45 a.m.

The residents quickly rushed her to the hospital. She was taken to Chittaranjan Medical College and Hospital, where she was declared

The police are investigating whether the incident was an accident or a suicide. Locales revealed that she had previously attempted suicide by cutting her wrist

West Bengal Police's Crime Investigation Department (CID) has busted a cyber fraud gang operating across multiple states and apprehended the ringleader from Gujarat, police said. The CIDWB arrested Shah

Darshil Pareshbhai, a resident of Bhavnagar, Gujarat, the mastermind of a multi-state scam racket, on April 19, the police said.

This arrest was the result of an investigation into a complaint by a retired person who lost around Rs 5 lakh due to a bank KYC update scam, leading to the registration of
